WELCOME

Welcome to Lakehill Preparatory School! We are so excited to have your kindergarten student joining our Warrior family. Kindergarten is such an incredible year. Our goal is to engage their minds, activate their curiosity, and inspire their natural love of learning. Included here are a few suggestions that will aid in nurturing their budding interest in letters and numbers.

READING

Reading to your child is paramount as it helps develop their vocabulary, their knowledge of the world, their interests, their understanding, their social skills, and their general curiosity. Read books, read signs as you are driving, read names of products at the grocery store, read everything you see to your child and show him or her the letters. Your child will enjoy the time with you and greatly benefit from the exposure to language.

Children learn best through play. Many games can reinforce basic skill development. Play games with the alphabet. Take turns reciting the ABC's, for example, you say A, your child says B, and so on. Play "I Spy" for example "Can you find something that has the B sound." Play alphabet Memory matching uppercase with the lowercase letters. Play rhyming games. Enjoy story telling together. Have your child retell the story from a favorite book or create an original story. Talk about what happens in the beginning, middle, and at the end.

Children take great pride in writing their names. Encourage your child to practice writing his or her name using upper and lowercase letters.

MATH

Learning numbers can also be fun. Play with dice and have your child count the dots. Make flashcards with the numbers 1-20 and play Memory or Go Fish or put the cards in order. Play Old Maid or Slap Jack or War with regular playing cards. Practice counting by ones to 10, to 20, to 50, to 100. Ask your child to find specific numbers at the grocery store or on your phone or on signs outside. Build a general awareness of numbers all around you.

Additionally, you could help your child learn are your names and your home address. It is important for children to know their parents first and last names and at least one parent's cell phone number.

Most importantly, enjoy time with your child this summer. Kindergartners are naturally curious and love to learn. Anything you do with them will be beneficial. We look forward to getting to know your child this coming year.
