# **HISTORY AND PHILOSOPHY**

Established in 1971, Lakehill Preparatory School is a highly-regarded, fully-accredited, co-educational school for students in kindergarten through grade 12. The Main Campus sits on six acres and offers classrooms, a gymnasium, an auditorium, two libraries, and multiple science and computer labs. The Opening Doors Expansion Project, completed in 2017, renovated 8,000 square feet of existing space and added an additional 16,000 square feet of new space and a 5,000 square foot courtyard with outdoor learning areas. The 17-acre Roger L. Perry Campus is home to the Warrior Athletic Complex and the Alice and Erle Nye Family Environmental Science Center.

Lakehill Preparatory School provides a rigorous, college preparatory curriculum combined with opportunities for personal growth, individual enrichment, and community engagement. From kindergarten through high school, every Lakehill student is encouraged to strive, challenged to succeed, and inspired to excel.

## **THE SENIOR INTERNSHIP PROGRAM**

Through the Senior Internship Program, all graduating seniors spend a two-week period observing and working in a field that they intend to pursue in college. Partnering with members of the Dallas business and professional community, seniors work a forty-hour week each week of the project, keep a log of their activities, and submit a paper outlining their internship experience. At the conclusion of their projects, seniors must pass an oral review by a committee of Lakehill faculty. Successfully passing the committee review is a requirement for graduation.

#### **CLASS RANK**

Lakehill Preparatory School does not rank its students due to the highly selective nature of our admission process and the small size of the graduating class.

#### **GRADE POINT AVERAGE**

Lakehill does not weight grades. The Lakehill grade point average is a cumulative calculation of a student's work completed at Lakehill from ninth grade onward. All courses taken at Lakehill are included on the transcript and in grade point average calculations (including repeated courses). Courses not taken at Lakehill, including those taken at other secondary and post-secondary institutions, are not included on the transcript or in the grade point average calculation unless the course is filling a minimum graduation requirement such as World Language. The grading system is A-F.

#### **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

A total of 26 credits are required for graduation with one credit equivalent to two semesters. In addition, six units of Athletics/Team Activities are required for students graduating prior to 2022. For the Class of 2023 and beyond, two semesters of athletic credit will be required.

# COVID-19

2019 - 2020: Classes were conducted online for the fourth quarter starting March 23, 2020. Fourth quarter grades were recorded yet did not negatively impact overall semester two grades.

2020 - 2021: Classes were conducted online for the first two weeks of the first quarter starting August 24, 2020. After Labor Day, Lakehill resumed a regular inperson schedule with the option for students who were immuncomprised or in quarentine to attend online throughout the year. Approximately 1/3 of the Class of 2022 remained online for three quarters. Lakehill classes were again conducted online for two weeks in January. In February, classes were halted for one week due to the freeze.

2021 - 2022: Classes were conducted as regularly scheduled.

# **COLLEGES ACCEPTING LAKEHILL GRADUATES FROM 2019 - 2022**

#### 100% of Lakehill graduates attend college after graduation.

The 28 members of the Class of 2022 were admitted to 75 different colleges and universities. This class will attend 24 different colleges in 13 states, with 32% studying in the state of Texas and 68% studying out of state. Seventy-one percent (71%) of the members of this class were awarded scholarships with a four-year value of 4.1 million dollars.
