9th Grade Summer Reading Assignment: The Big Sleep

This summer you will read: *The Big Sleep* by Raymond Chandler, ISBN 10: 0394758285, ISBN 13: 978-0394758282.

This is a hard-boiled mystery that explores the corruption of society, wealth and status, cynicism, survival, masculinity, and gender roles.

As you read, consider and annotate for the following:

- 1. How is Philip Marlowe characterized?
 - A. How does Philip Marlowe display traits of masculinity? How does this fit with "traditional" views of masculinity?
 - B. How does Marlowe's masculine actions and traits influence his views of other characters and the world?
 - C. How do Marlowe's prejudices impact his experiences?
- 2. How are the women characterized in the novel?
 - A. Compare their characterization with that of Marlowe.
 - B. Consider how Marlowe views/describes them.
- 3. How are characters of various classes depicted in the novel?
 - A. How is social mobility, meaning moving from one class to another, usually from a lower class to upper class depicted?
 - B. How does Chandler characterize consequences for the various classes?
 - C. How and why is Marlowe able to interact with each of these classes and how does he view his relationship to them?
 - i. How does Marlowe view the various characters within their social class?
- 4. How does Chandler depict LA?
 - A. Consider how those in power behave and what Marlowe learns about them throughout the novel.
 - B. Compare the societal norms and expectations of the various classes and how they interact with the setting. What does this say about society?
- 5. Which characters are cynical about the city, power, survival?
- 6. How are additional crimes or immoral activities tied to the original crime Marlowe is asked to investigate?
 - A. What does this say about society?
 - B. What does this say about the various other characters?
 - C. What does this say about social class?
- 7. Consider how thematic ideas and characters in the novel display ideas about the American dream.
